The *Teaching Assistant Development Programme* (TADP), developed by Anspear and the National Association of Teaching Assistants (NAPTA), provides TAs with flexible and personalised opportunities for development. By adopting the TADP, schools can help teaching assistants (TAs) build confidence and increase the contribution that they make to support learning and teaching.

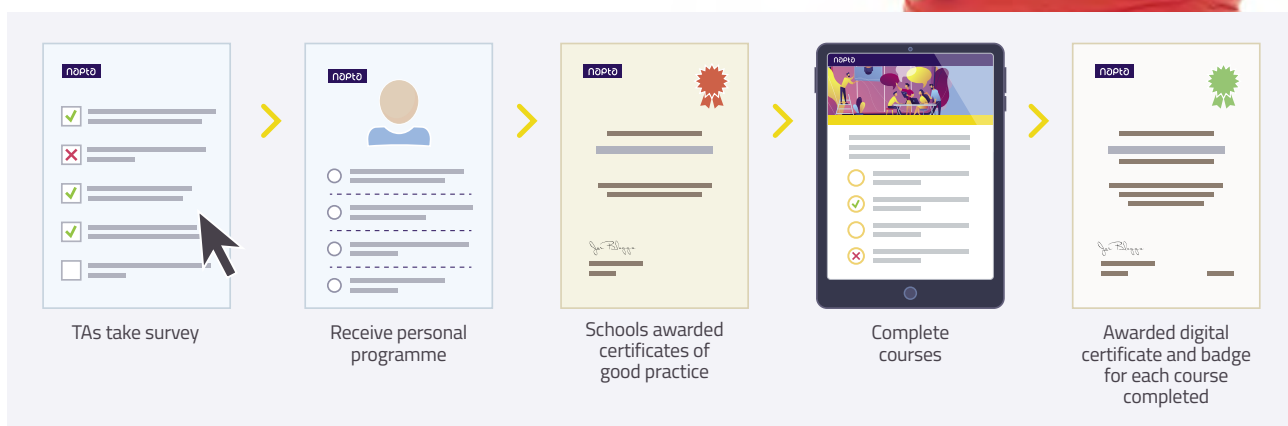
How it works

Each TA completes a simple online self-evaluation which analyses their professional development needs.

Give teaching assistants a greater say in their own development

Based on their responses, the system builds an individually tailored programme of courses from Anspear's *TAPD Library*. Each course will target an area they wish to improve upon. This will help TAs build on strengths, gain confidence in weaker areas and have a say in their own development.

The courses can be completed flexibly at any time or place, and can be built into existing staff training provision.



Progress reports

The school receives a report summarising all the TAs' responses, helping leaders make decisions about deployment. Those managing the programme also receive reports for individual TAs, with information on engagement and progress.

Confident, expert TAs make a real difference to educational outcomes and when well deployed, can help to control costs. The effective training and development of TAs can therefore be crucial. With the TADP, schools can:
